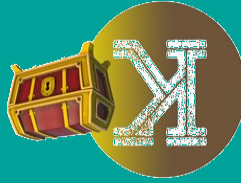


Don't forget to practice to update your reading journals and to practice your Weekly Spelling Words in time for your test!
