We will be learning the difference between canon and unison movements and incorporating these into a routine.

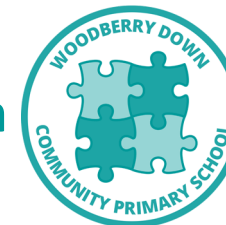
We will also be practising how to use our bodies to create routines, building on the knowledge and skills from previous weeks to perform at the end of the half term.

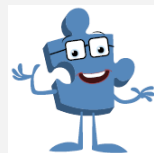


RE / PSHCE

Explorers and Adventurers



IPC

Our IPC unit this term is 'Explorers and Adventurers' and focusing on our host country of Peru.

We will be developing our knowledge, skills and understanding of:

- Gathering information
- Magnetism
- How to make a compass
- Drawing plants and animals with precision



Reading

Year Four are expected to regularly read 'free-choice readers' and complete our reading journals. Please share this with us at home. We should also take comprehension tests about our accelerated reader books.

In SFA and RWI, Year Four read with a partner daily. In these lessons we read a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts and regularly practise reading to develop our fluency and expression.

We analyse texts and identify features of fiction and non-fiction texts as well as looking for interesting vocabulary that we can use in our writing.

We are learning to locate evidence in a text to answer treasure hunt questions which our teacher tests us on

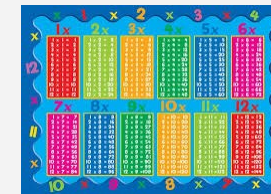
Mathematics

Year Four will be developing our knowledge, skills and understanding of multiplication and division and how these two operations are linked. We will learn how to multiply 4-digit numbers by a single digit as well as recognising when to regroup.

We will also learn how to use short division, dividing 4-digit numbers by a single digit. We will be able to explain if there is a remainder or not and why.

We will continue practising our skills of how to read and construct pictograms, bar charts and line graphs that show discrete and continuous data.

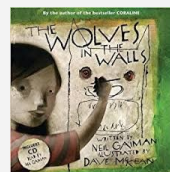
Don't forget to help us practise our weekly times tables at home!
