Look Hear! & Bake It!



IPC Topic

This term we will explore two different IPC topics; Look Hear! and Bake it! Which have a focus on science and technology.

In Look Hear! we will focus on the different properties of light and sound and how the human ear and eye functions by conducting research and testing out theories.

In Bake It! we will look at conducting scientific investigations, making predictions and drawing conclusions about the different properties of materials and their changing states.

Reading

In SFA this half term, children will be further developing their inference skills. Children will be asked to take on the role of author, questioning why authors used certain language and styles and exploring their intended impact.

Children will be reading a range of different texts, including fiction, non-fiction and poetry.

Mathematics

In Maths this half term, we will look at applying the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) in the context of money. This will involve multi-step word problems and investigations to replicate real-life scenarios.

We will also be re-visiting time as a measurement to support the children using this in everyday situations.

In geometry, we will focus on the properties of shapes, position and direction and co-ordinates.

Writing

This half term we will continue to focus on SPaG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) in Year 5. The children will go into great depth in how to identify statements, questions, instructions and commands.

The first two weeks of Spring 2 are Writing Weeks; we are analysing two different texts inspired by Shakespeare's Romeo And Juliet, plus, analysing film clips of the play to enrich our writing.
